The nature of Christianity is inherently radical (cf. Matt. 5:14-16; Rom. 12:1-2). But what does “radical” mean? While various secular associations with the word may put us off; the biblical imperatives are, however, no less demanding. To restore Christianity is to restore a very radical idea! Radical Christianity

- The place of God, love, and others (Mk. 12:28-34; Matt. 6:33)
- Christ-likeness (Eph. 4:14-15)
- Relevance found in an eternal anchor (Jude 3; I Cor. 9:19-23; Gal. 1:10)
- Needs valued over wants (Matt. 6:11)
- Biblical wisdom over secular wisdom (Jer. 23:18; I Cor. 1:18-30)
- Church family over self (Eph. 4:16; I Cor. 12:12-14, 27)
- A passion for souls rooted in thankfulness to Christ (II Cor. 5:11-15)
- Truth, not tradition (Mk. 7:1-13)
